

The DMV is at it once again!

Inside each envelope was a Form Letter regarding changes to the Horseless Carriage and Collector Vehicle Plate regulations recently changed by Senate Bill 5127. The new requirements are that you must have another Vehicle registered in your name for daily driving and have an insurance policy on your Collector Vehicle. In that letter it stated that compliance must be met by January 15, 2026. I found this interesting since the letter was Post Marked January 20, 2026.

Ok, so timeliness is not really their thing, but hopefully they got the details correct. Every time a person renews the license on a Vehicle in this state they pay a fee for maintaining the States Computer System (AKA money grab) and by my estimate they should have a Jim Dandy System by now! So lets see how they did with all that Computing Power.

First of all the Computer should know who has what Vehicles and be able to organize them by Owner. There should be no need for six separate letters all to the same Address.

Of the six letters two of them were for Vehicles that were sold years ago. One has to wonder just how well they are keeping track of this stuff.

One of our Vehicles completely fell off the Radar and even though I gave them the Plate Number and my Owner information they still had no record of it.

On a positive note they did manage to get four out of the six correct with only one omission.
